

1. Will it be possible to order a DVD or download an ISO?

### **I have multiple computers, do have to download Windows 10 on each computer?**

You can download a .ISO file and upgrade each computer offline. The ISO should be available by the time Windows 10 launches. (You will be able to download ISO media for Windows 10 RTM).

*Please note, you might have to download the appropriate edition of Windows 10 for the version/edition of Windows you are upgrading. If you upgrade to the wrong edition, i.e. Windows 7 Home Premium to Windows 10 Pro, you will have to purchase a license for Windows 10 Pro or roll-back to Windows 7 Home Premium and upgrade to Windows 10 Home.*

## ***How to: upgrade from previous versions of Windows using Windows 10 ISO file***

### **Summary**

*As we approach the launch of Windows 10 this summer, hundreds of millions of existing Windows users will be taking advantage the opportunity to upgrade their current version to Windows 10 for free. This represents an unprecedented change in Microsoft's business model of requiring purchase of a license. Windows 10 will be offered two ways to existing Windows 7 and Windows 8/8.1 users. You will be able to download the update through Windows Update, or you can download ISO media and use it do an in place upgrade. For many persons, using ISO media will be the preferred method since you will have a backup copy for reinstall purposes if needed. Also for persons with limited bandwidth, this will be an excellent way avoid the need to download the update more than once if you have multiple computers. So lets take a look at upgrading to Windows 10.*

### **Details**

**Notes:**

- *Gather all important application discs and hardware driver discs you might need to be reinstalled.*
- *Check the manufacturer and software developers website for updates available and to find out about the status of compatibility with Windows 10. It is possible that software is compatible with Windows 7 will work with Windows 10 since they share the same driver model.*
- *If you are using software such as iTunes or Adobe programs, remember to de-authorize and deactivate them before running setup.*

***When making significant changes to your computer such as an upgrade, it is always recommended you backup your system prior to installing a new version of Windows.***

**What you can do before attempting the upgrade?**

*You can do some pre-requisite tasks to ensure a smooth migration to Windows 10. If you are using a name brand computer such as a Dell or HP, go to the manufacturers website for the model computer you are using and download the latest available drivers for that computer. Store them on a disc or USB thumb drive. Important drivers you should try to obtain include Chipset, Network and Video Drivers. Its possible that they might have only Windows 7 drivers, those will work with Windows 10.*

*Other things you can do:*

- 1. Uninstall any security software before attempting to upgrade.*
- 2. Disable any encryption software you might have installed.*
- 3. Disable/uninstall disk utility software such as DVD/CD burning utilities or third party defragment programs such as Perfect Disk.*
- 4. Make sure your computer is updated (devices and applications).*
- 5. Disconnect any external devices before installing.*
- 6. Check your hard disk for any errors:*

*- Click Start*

*- Type: CMD*

*- Right click CMD then click Run as administrator*

*At the Command Prompt, type: chkdsk /r /f*

*Exit the command prompt.*

*When you restart your system, your computer will be scanned for errors and attempts will be made to correct them.*

- 7. Another thing you can do is disable Start items:*

- Click Start*

- Type: MSCONFIG.*

- Hit Enter on your keyboard*

- On the General tab, click Selective Startup.*

- Under Selective Startup, click to clear the Load Startup Items check box.*

- Click the Services tab, click to select the Hide All Microsoft Services check box, and then click Disable All.*

- Click OK.*

- When you are prompted, click Restart.*

- After the computer starts, check whether the problem is resolved.*

*Run the System File Checker utility.*

*SFC/Scannow checks your Windows installation for errors and corrects them. This will help with ensuring that a smooth upgrade occurs.*

*Click Start*

*Type: CMD, from the results, right click CMD*

*Click 'Run as Administrator'*

*(Windows 8/8.1 users - press Windows key + X > click Command Prompt (Admin))*

*At the Command Prompt, type: sfc/scannow*

*This will check for any integrity violations*

*Restart your system*

*Please note, you might have to download the appropriate edition Windows 10 for the version/edition of Windows you are upgrading. If you upgrade to the wrong edition, ie. Windows 7 Home Premium to Windows 10 Pro, you will have to purchase a license for Windows 10 Pro or rollback Windows 7 Home Premium and upgrade to Windows 10 Home.*

2. Will we receive a separate License Key for Windows 10, or will it be the same as our Windows 7 / 8 / 8.1 License Key?

By default, Windows 10 builds are pre-keyed, meaning, you do not have to enter a product key and should not be prompted to enter one even after Windows 10 has completed setup.

You can still examine your product key, with the use of a free program such as Belarq.

3. If using the Windows 7 / 8 / 8.1 License Key, will there be a separate counter for Activations Remaining for Windows 10, or does it share activation count with the earlier OS?

**You can rearm it up to 5 times. After the 5th reinstall, reactivation by telephone might be required.**

4. Does the Windows Free Upgrade offer also apply to Volume Licensing solutions?

**No.** Volume License customers running Windows 7 Enterprise or Windows 8/8.1 Enterprise or volume license editions of Windows 7 Professional or Windows 8/8.1 Pro do not qualify for this offer.

**How will I know when Windows 10 is available?**


Between now and launch, the following KB update (<https://support.microsoft.com/en-us/kb/3035583>) should be installed on your Windows 7/8.1 computer. Volume License customers will not receive this update because of IT requirements in managed environments. If its not already installed, open Windows Update and check for Updates.

5.) Can we install Windows 10 for free as a Dual Boot option?

**Will I have the option of choose a different drive or partition where I want the upgrade installed?**

No, it will require that you are running a previous qualifying version and start the upgrade from within the qualifying version.

6. Can we choose to upgrade later, but receive the upgraded license now?
